ween Party on October 26th.


Hope to see a good turnout of our club and their cars at these events. - Chief

Just Ask Layton

With the club drive to Robber's Cave and Talimena Drive coming up this weekend, I thought I would do a follow up to last month's article with some additional information.

I contacted two of our members that have extensive cross country experience in a variety of Flathead Fords with surprisingly little trouble experienced on the road. I think much of this good luck is really attributed to good overall maintenance and keeping their cars in top shape before ever leaving for the trip.

I first spoke with Donovan Smith who has made many long trips in his 1940 Business Coupe. Donovan let me know that the Business Coupe has lots of space behind the seats and a large open trunk as well (this is why the bootleggers liked this car so much), which you will see is important when I share the list of parts he usually took with him. Donovan also usually traveled in groups of others in old cars so that they could help one another if issues did come up.

I also talked to David Jensen who never hesitates to jump in any of his cars and drive cross country alone if needed; not sure many other members could keep up with him anyway from what I have heard. David also has taken long trips in his 34' five-window coupe, mostly trouble free as well. This tells me that David really knows how to build a good dependable car built to be driven!

Both guys went through their list and other than a few items, the lists were almost identical; these guys go prepared! Here is a quick rundown of most of what they take: Spare set of water pumps, spare generator, one of them takes a starter and has actually used it on a trip, carburetor distributor or extra points, coil and condenser, fuel pump, extra fuel line, fan belt, spare plugs and plug wire, spare upper and lower radiator hoses, clamps, spare headlight, and assorted bulbs, tow strap or chain (Dave said in case he needs to tow someone else), extra fluids, hydraulic jack and assorted wood blocks, and of course tool kit with proper tools for old Fords, manuals, and flashlights.

Wow, that's a list, but you can't get most of these items at an auto parts store so you need to be prepared! Dave did tell me that one time he cracked a head somewhere in Washington state and had his son overnight ship one to his hotel and he replaced it in the parking lot and made it home! I like this approach, I don't like going anywhere without at least tools and a few items.

Well, I hope this weekend trip is uneventful in this way, but if anyone has a problem, we will all jump in and help I'm sure!


Ken graduated from Dawson High School in Nebraska in 1956 and went on to serve in the United States Navy during the Vietnam War

October Recipe

I See You Snacks

Ingredients

9 c. Rice Chex cereal

1/2 c. creamy almond butter

4 tbsp. unsalted butter

2 1/2 c. semisweet chocolate chips, divided

1/2 tsp. pure vanilla extract

Kosher salt 2 c. confectioners' sugar

1/2 c. candy eyes

Directions: Place cereal in large bowl and set aside. In separate large microwave-safe bowl, combine almond butter, butter, and 1 cup chocolate chips. Microwave

on 50% power in 15-second intervals, stirring in between, until melted and smooth.

Stir in vanilla and 1/2 teaspoon salt. Drizzle over cereal and fold until well coated.

To resealable gallon-size bag, add half of cereal mixture and half of sugar. Seal, then shake until cereal is evenly coated; transfer to bowl. Repeat with other half of cereal and sugar in same bag. Fold in remaining 1 1/2 cups chocolate chips and candy eyes. [Submitted by Janell Diehl]
