January Recipe:

Chocolate Rum Cake

A favorite of members Ann and Monty Buechline

1 pkg chocolate cake mix 1 pkg (4-serving size) Jell-O Chocolate Instant Pudding and Pie Filling

4 eggs 1/2 cup Bacardi rum

1/2 cup cold water

1/2 cup Wessen oil

FILLING:

1 pint (2 cups) heavy cream

1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa

1/2 cup confectioners sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

1/2 cup Bacardi rum



DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 F. Grease and flour two 9'' layer cake pans. Combine all cake ingredients together in large boul. Blend well, then beat at medium mixer speed 2 minutes. Turn into prepared pans.

Bake 30 minutes or until cake tests done. Do not underbake. Cool in pans 10 minutes. Remove from pans, finish cooling on racks. Split layers in half horizontally. Stack.

Spread 1 cup filling between each layer and over top of cake. Keep cake chilled. Serve cold.

For filling : combine cream, cocoa, sugar and vanilla in large mixer bowl. Beat until stiff. Fold in rum. Makes 4 cups.

Member Forum:

Just Ask Layton

It's hard to believe it's already 2020! This month I received a couple of questions from Mr. Don Diehl so let's see if we can help. Don wants to know what oil Brand and weight to use in his rebuilt 1950 flathead engine. Seems like a straight forward question doesn't it? Well, after doing some research, I think this may be one of the most disputed topics ever! Some say "It's a flathead, not a race engine so it doesn't matter." While others go into great detail and specifics of chemical makeup and viscosity discussions only a scientist would understand! Now that my brain hurts, I'm just going to pass on what My very trusted mechanic told me when I asked the same question for my new rebuilt Ford flathead engine.

For breaking the engine in, you must use petroleum-based oils, no synthetics, so that the rings will seat. He recommended Valvoline VR-1 30W. This is a high-quality racing oil with good zinc content and is what they use in all their new engines. This is what I have in my new flathead and plan to continue with. You could use synthetic later on after the engine is really broke in I suppose, but I plan to use Valvoline VR-1 always. It is not cheap or easy to find but O'Reillys can order it for you. As much as it cost to rebuild my engine, I don't think using cheap oil to save a buck makes much sense. As far as the 30W, I read that the old Ford bulletins from the 30s recommended 20W for winter and 40W for summer so 30W seams like a good all around choice.

Don also asked about "Modern" oil filtration systems besides the canister type on Flatheads. I know that mine does not have any oil filter on it (1940) and I believe the canister type was an add-on option. There may be another type oil filter on later engines that I don't know about so if anyone can help, please let me or Don know.

Don also asked what additives do you recommend (or changing of oil) to remedy the smoking of my original flathead in my old 4 door? Personally, I don't have any suggestions because additives never seem to work in my experience and I have tried lots of them. But if anyone has a suggestion, please let us know.

And finally Don has questions about converting the positive ground 6V electrical system to 12V negative ground and still retaining the 6V generator (hope I said that correctly). My cars are still 6V traditional systems and I have no experience converting one but I'm sure some of our members can help. Until next month, keep those Ford V8s going!
